#### **SUNDAY SCHOOL**



Our Sunday School classrooms are nicely decorated, the kids' photos are on the wall and each student has a binder for their work and handouts.

Here's a synopsis of the topics that we covered last month. The children are very engaged and have interesting questions, answers and comments.


- $\cdot$  9/15 The Elevation of the Cross, and, the finding of the True Cross by St. Helen, financed by her son, St. Constantine., and what that specifically means to Orthodox Christians, as well as what the Cross and Jesus dying on the Cross meant for us and our Salvation.
- · 9/22 We discussed Jonah and The Whale, and how Jonah being in the belly of the whale prefigured Christ's being in the tomb for three days and rising. Jonah, too, "rose", when he was spat out and finally agreed to warn the people of Niniveh, as God had asked him to do to

begin with, yet Jonah refused. We discussed how Jonah stretched out his hands in the belly of the whale, making himself into the shape of the cross.

- ·9/29 The children acted out the play of David and Goliath, and discussed how David could beat the Giant in an unfair contest, because he had God on his side, even though he chose not to wear the armor given to him by the King to protect him.
- · 10/6 We watched a two-part video about Noah and the Ark, and we discussed in detail how and why it was necessary for Noah to build the ark, as well as how the animals were gathered to go into it. We also studied a very unusual icon written to depict the Ark and Noah and all the others who are in the symbolic ark, and what each figure in the icon represents. We also discussed something God promised never to do again, as well as what the rainbow means.

#### Stewardship Report - Fall 2024

#### The Stewardship Commitment

Making a financial promise to the church is an exercise in spirituality and an act of gratitude. An annual pledge helps us transform our relationship with money and things and reorient our lives to God. It has the added benefit of allowing the parish to plan the best use of our resources.

#### Journey to Generosity

As Orthodox Christians, we believe that all we have has been entrusted to us by God. How we use our time, the gifts of our hands and heart, and the treasure of our lives, matters. Being a good steward is as simple as that.

 Through the third quarter of this year, compared to the same period last year, stewardship donations are relatively flat. The current trajectory adds to the financial strain on our parish.

#### Taking the Next Step

Taking the next step is an opportunity to enrich our understanding of Christian stewardship and generosity. The focus is on the need of each person to contribute proportionately from their resources as a part of their own spiritual maturity and discipleship of Christ.

 There has been a welcome increase in regular monthly stewardship donations, from 28% last year, to 34% of the total this year.

We are asking each person to consider taking a step up in their giving as their response to all God has done for them. This biblical approach to financial stewardship effectively helps people make progress in one aspect of their spiritual journey.

How we fulfill this commitment is up to each of us, keeping in mind that giving back to God a portion of what He has given us is crucial to spiritual health.

There is a fee of \$100 for materials, supplies and labor.

<u>ARTOKLASIA:</u> Blessing of the Five Loaves is a service of thanksgiving through which we express our gratitude for all the blessings of life. The Blessing is offered on a feast day or special occasion. If you need Artoklasia prepared, contact Angel Lekos, <u>angelmou1@att.net</u>.
